SECTION- A: READING (20 MARKS)

If I do which I desire more than else anything in the world and which makes me happy, such work can never be an aberration. Words from the Twenty Six Psalm come to my mind while I work "Examine me, O Lord and prove me".
- (4) Total commitment is a crucial quality for those who want to reach the very top of their profession. The desire to work at optimum capacity leaves hardly any room for anything else. I have known others who used to work for 60, 80 and even 100 hours a week. They used to find their work exciting and rewarding. Total commitment is is the denominator among all successful men and women. Are you able to manage the stresses that you encounter in life? The difference between an energetic and a confused person is the difference in the way their minds handle their experiences. Man needs his difficulties because they are necessary to enjoy success. All of us carry some sort of super intelligence within us .Let it be stimulated to examine our deepest thoughts, desires and beliefs.
- (5) Once you have done this- charge yourself as it were to the commitment to your work. You also need good health and boundless energy. Climbing to the top demands strength whether it is top of Mount Everest or to the top of your career. People are born with different energy reserves and one who tires first and burns out easily will do well to recognize his or her life to the earliest.
