Section {A} Reading

Q.1. Read the passage given below and answer the questions that follow. (8)

(i) In India, sugarcane based ethanol is used as a petrol substitute and oils from Jatropha and other oilseeds are used as diesel substitutes. At present, biodiesel production is negligible. The efforts are focused on using non-edible oils from plants (JatrophaI, Curcas, Pangamia and Pinnatta) and animal fats like fish oil. The focus is to encourage the use of wasteland for the cultivation of these hardy bio-fuel crops. However, problems in terms of availability of land, water, technical rights and ecological conditions need to be overcome.

(ii) To assess the feasibility scenario in Rajasthan and Odisha, a survey was conducted in 41 villages to interact with Jatropha cultivators. The project study noted that climatic conditions are better for Jatropha plantation in Odisha than in Rajasthan. Low temperatures in winter and scarcity of water resulted in low yield in Rajasthan. In both, state governments provide credit / loans to cultivators. Timely availability of quality planting material is very important for promotion of Jatropha. Nursery establishment should be given priority. The support system for training, resource mobilisation and information exchange for the farmers needs to be strengthened.

(iii) Even though the area under Jatropha has increased, it has not achieved good production levels. But there is good news for bio-diesel enthusiasts. Hindustan Petroleum and the Chhattisgarh Renewal Energy Development Agency (CREDA) are partnering to bring an additional 15000 hectares of wasteland under cultivation to increase Jatropha production. In the current scenario, ever rising energy demands and rising global crude prices, economic development and emission of greenhouse gases are the reasons to promote production of Jatropha and use of bio-fuels as an energy source across the world. From an Indian prospective, the National Mission on Biodiesel was launched in 2003 to address the low level progress in this field. Biodiesel scenario is all set to be improved with increase in the production of Jatropha in India.

(i) The value of higher education cannot be underestimated considering the contemporary realities of the competitive marketplace. A higher education degree literally serves as the first impression of a jobseeker applying for employment. A college degree is a person's pass to the business world and so work-related opportunities are enormous. Truth is, college degrees are never the same if we take into account the reputation of higher establishment as well as the prestige of a particular field of studies.

(ii) Today's holders of college degrees have unprecedented opportunities of job search since the employment market has largely expanded through online domains, offering freelance and part-time vacancies. Though, in both real and virtual employment, it is always a person's CV (resume) that is initially considered by an employer, in 95% of cases the inclusion of a college degree is a must to get a well-paid job.

(iii) Overall, college education provides students with appropriate knowledge and skills to be used later in real life circumstances and the working environment. However, career choices do not matter since the contemporary market is vast and enormous.

(iv) In particular, college education enables students to gain preliminary information about many essential aspects required to cope with real-life challenges. Then students expand their knowledge and acquire practical skills by grasping abstract theories and concepts. A college curriculum teaches students how to clearly express personal standpoints and opinions both in conversation and writing. In most cases students acquire global thinking as well as thinking relevant to the solution of specific problems.

(v) Furthermore, students learn how to work in teams and solve tasks in cooperation; this enables establishment of team spirit and ability to make a personal contribution to overall mutual achievement. Various case studies based on real-life experiences teach students to understand the subject better and therefore adapt to further complexities.

To this end, it goes without saying that a college degree always means more employment opportunities since it is the identification of one's academic qualification.
